"ATSA 2014 re-cap"

Actuarials (Dan, Paul, Brian Judd in absentia via Paul)

- Static-99R: Collapsing four groups into two groups
- Article passed around by Paul (from Andrew Harris): High-risk offenders may not always be high-risk
- 38% of high risk offenders recidivated in 10 years, lw rates after that
- After 10 years, the high risk group is about 4%, low risk around 1%
- After 10 years, high risk not that different from low risk
- ROC = .63-.64
- Static 2002R: Some change in items, more focus on deviancy than 99
- Numbers are good, but not as many studies as 99
- Recidivism rates a little lower than 99 rates
- VRAG-R: Risk of violence in community
- Still incorporates violent offenses; Paul discusses concern that this might over-estimate sexual recidivism
- Recidivism occurred soon after release; drop off after 100 months
- Once they cross about 14 years, their risk is similar to risk that a general offender would commit a sex offense
- SORAG: Risk of sex offenses in community
- SORAG ROC = .65-.71 (depends on info used to score)

Internet sexual behavior (JW)

PPG (DK)

- Warm-up period, getting person acclimated, very important
- Changes in use of PPG, concerns about how it used
- Tougher to get it mandated as a procedure (in Fed system)
- "Actual Child Voices" (MK) - new stimulus tool

- Research on nature, scope, scale of the issues - what actually happening? What are current campus policies/programs/responses
