SOPB/ legislative updates

- 1. Nominations are in for two general board positions, treasurer, and Eastern Washington representative. Survey Monkey election to be sent out soon.
- 2. C. McNally officially resigned from the board on 3/13 and he nominated Brent Borg as his replacement. B. Borg's bio includes: I have been with SOTAP in DOC since 2015. I started as a clinician, then supervised and have managed the program since January of 2018. Before DOC I worked in CPS for 15 years in various roles and locations. I have worked in schools, in community mental health, in domestic violence perpetrator treatment, and in early childhood programs, along with other clinical work. I am a certified trainer at the independent level for the Static 99R, the Stable 2007, and the Acute 2007. I'm an LICSW, with an MSW from EWU and a Bachelor's in psychology from UW. The board voted unanimously to accept C. McNally's resignation and appoint B. Borg as the new DOC liaison.
- 3. The joint board meeting with the Oregon chapter will be 5/13 at McMenamins Kalama Harbor Lodge.
- 4. ATSA has begun a 'chapter engagement fund' to allow chapters that are struggling financially to apply to receive funds. The board voted unanimously to contribute \$500 to the fund.
- 5. D. Winter, H. Coryell, and L. Trifiletti are continuing to work on the by-laws revision.
- 6. ATSA started a 'chapter engagement fund' to allow financially struggling chapters to apply for funds. The board voted unanimously to donate \$500 to the fund. M. O'Connell volunteered to be on a list of presenters willing to do trainings on the behalf of struggling chapters.
- 7. The board revisited the discussion of hiring a lobbyist.

8. L. Trifiletti discussed her goals for the remainder of her term as president. These goals include having a central cloud for all documents, including "running minutes" which document board activity between meetings; having a adequate chapter insurance; an onboarding process and board position descriptions; and updated bylaws.

DOH Advisory Committee): No new updates.

<u>DOC Update (D. Winter)</u>: DOC is working on how community notification for LRA clients should go. There are some problematic aspects to the process that exacerbate community frustration.

<u>SCC Update (M.Reese)</u>: Q13 did a story on the SCC which aired. Disability Rights Washington will be conducting a review of SCC. SCC is almost fully staffed with new hires starting next month. Work groups have been formed to update curriculum for non-treatment-specific groups. Staff is working to update how they document treatment to makes it more accessible and understandable to residents. There have been issues between SCC and defense attorneys/ social workers related to residents transitioning into the community.

<u>Juvenile Rehabilitation Update (J. Pelander)</u>: A Program Specialist V has been hired to focus on improving a treatment program for residential placement. HB 1394, if passed, will have policy implications for DCYF.
